
UNDERSTANDING CONSERVATION EFFORTS FOR WOLVES WORLDWIDE

I have a passion for wolves and what they do for the ecosystem. Unfortunately, they have been demonized since colonization.


I want to tell photographic stories about the conservation effort for wolves. I want to increase awareness so more people know of their plight.

is key.


LOCATION

I will be located at *Centro de Recuperação do Lobo Ibérico* (CRLI), 40 minutes north of Lisbon Portugal. This location is relevant to me because this is the only volunteering program that allows habitat contact with wolves.



I worked with the sanctuary's staff, helping them feed the wolves, clean the enclosure, and observe the wolves' behavior. Every day was a new adventure, and I got a chance to be a wolf biologist and artist at the same time! Dream come true. With all the hard work and conversation I had. I must say that I learned what it takes to care for wild wolves and why conservation is important. Communities and children got to see the wolves when they visted and we got the chance to give them a tour around the sanctuary.

The wolf sanctuary also has a guard dog program where they breed and raise dogs to protect livestock to reduce friction between wolves and farmers. It is a method to co-exist with wolves and teach people about different ways to live with animals. In order to keep wolves off your "territory," you have to speak their language. Have another canine!

 many years.




INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

- Wolves are a native species who keeps the ecosystem balanced, without them, the environment will falter over time. What do you think we should do to prevent wolf and human issues?





















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
